Things that happened during the first week of May

May 1 was the birthday of Arthur Wellesley, later Duke of Wellington, in 1769, of Sonny Ramadhin in 1929, Una Stubbs in 1937 and of Joanna Lumley in 1946.

May 2 is the Feast day of Saints Gennys, Athanasius, Mefalda, Wiborada, Waldebert, Exuperius and Zoe, and Ultan of Fosses.

On May 3, 1808 a duel was fought from two hot-air balloons over Paris, the first of its kind

May 4 was the date in 1471 when the Battle of Tewkesbury, the last battle in the Wars of the Roses, took place; the Yorkists defeated the Lancastrians. In 1780 the first Derby was run at Epsom; the winner was Diomed, and in 1896 the first issue of the *Daily Mail* was published in London.

May 5 was the day in 1921 when Chanel No. 5 perfume was launched. It was also the day in 1803 when George Borrow was born, and when Syd Lawrence died in 1998.

May 6 was the day in 1840 when the Penny Black was issued, Sigmund Freud was born in 1856, and Marlene Dietrich died in 1992.

May 7 is the Feast day of, among others, St. John of Beverley. Greece became an independent kingdom in 1832, and in 1928 women in England were allowed to vote at the tender age of 21, as opposed to 30. Pyotr Il'yich Tchaikovsky was born in 1840 and Gary Cooper in 1901.

Know Your Rights! Advice from Trading Standards

Buying at car boot sales

Car boot sales can be great places to pick up a bargain. However, consumers buying second hand goods need to be vigilant!

Some used items may have lost their instructions and warnings, designed to ensure their safe use, whilst wear and tear may also have affected their safety. Electrical products especially may have old wiring and damaged plugs that could be a potential fire hazard. Beware of old painted toys - the paint might contain lead.

Car Boot Sales can be an ideal venue for disposing of counterfeit goods. Counterfeit DVDs are often of poor quality - some may even be blank! Computer software may not work properly and watch out too for fake alcohol. Spirits labeled 'Russian Vodka' may be little more than meths!

Remember, buying from a private seller, is not like buying from a trader. If you buy from a trader you have more rights and if there is a problem with the goods you can return to the shop to sort it out. However, if you buy from a private seller, the only requirement is that the goods are described correctly.
