

THE QUEEN'S DIAMOND JUBILEE MEDALS

The Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal is the official Medal designed to mark HRM The Queen's 60 years on the throne. It is awarded to Emergency Service Personnel and Community First Responders who respond to the scene of 999 calls and who are potentially placing themselves in danger. In order to receive the Medal the person has to be in service on 06-02-12 and have completed five full calendar year's service.



We have actually been in service for more than nine years and so on the 21st August we were visited by a senior Ambulance Office , who on behalf of the Queen, presented us with our Medals.

MATTERS DISCUSSED

Finance

An unqualified audit report was issued for the year ended 31 March 2012. The fee of £60 was paid.

Planning

Application for Change of use of land for the erection of a proposed specialist sheep housing building together with associated Laboratory and veterinary building/handling facility comprising of a mixed B1 and Sui Generis Use, area for the slaughtering of sheep and associated storage area at Church Farm had been received. A Public Meeting was held on 20th August, attended by Paul and Tom Heritage, to answer questions and hear concerns regarding this application. The Parish Council have presented concerns to SDC on a number of issues.

Amended application for erection of poultry rearing building and associated building containing education/display area, office, coffee bar, store and toilets with car parking at Edgehill Stud was returned with no objection.

Planning was consent granted to fell horse chestnut tree at corner of Rouse Lane. Niall Conway has carried out this work. W.C.C. will take out the root.

Highways

A number of issues are still outstanding for the Highways Department to carry out. Further contact will be made.

Code of Conduct

Community Governance (Parish) Review

The first stage of this review is being carried out by Stratford District Council to

consider whether the existing Parish Councils are reflective of the identities and interests of the communities and whether it is appropriate for Parish Councils to be merged, altered or abolished. We have no changes to raise at this time.

NATIONAL TRUST launches drive to discover nation's favourite walk

Upton House joins the nationwide search that is being launched this month by the National Trust to find the country's ten Greatest British Walks.

Walkers from around the country are being encouraged to upload information about their favourite walk to the Great British Walk website at www.nationaltrust.org.uk/greatbritishwalk.

By submitting details of their favourite walk, they will get the chance to win a stay in a National Trust holiday cottage and have their walk scrutinised by a panel of judges as they decide the ten best walks.

A panel of experts including *BBC Countryfile* presenter Julia Bradbury, Editor of *Country Walking Magazine* Vincent Crump and National Trust walking champion Chloe Bradbrooke from Nymans in Surrey will then meet to pick the top ten walks based on criteria including the historical importance of the walk or the spectacular views seen on the route.

"We all know that the Edge Hill area is famed for its outstanding natural beauty histological significance and now is the chance for proud residents of the Warwickshire/Oxfordshire borders to prove just how much we have to offer," said Heather Aston, Head Gardener and 'keen walker'. "Let's get together and make sure Upton House gets it chance to shine."

The winning walks will be illustrated showing the route and places of interest along the way; they will be published online next year. The people who submitted the walks will get to keep the original artwork.

The competition, which forms part of the two-month long annual festival of walking, organised in partnership with PruHealth, is designed to enable people to share their passion for local walks helping others discover new routes.

If you would like to experience the walks from Upton House and Gardens simply park in our car park, collect your choice of three different walks or try our autumn colour trail around Upton's gardens.. If you want to start before 11 am we suggest you collect your walk note the day before and then set off a time to suit yourselves and return to Upton for much need refreshment in our wonderful restaurant at the end of your walk. You can then spend time enjoying the wonderful gardens or see the amazing Glenn Brown Art Exhibition.

Upton House and gardens are now open 6 days a week and will be closed on Thursdays.

WOT2Grow YOUR Community Orchard

The highlight for August was the master class in summer pruning from our consultant John Edgeley. As always a fascinating insight into the different ways of pruning and how to get the best framework on the canes for next year's harvest. We also found a great way to tie in the raspberry canes using a continuous piece of twine! Having cut out the old fruiting canes on the summer raspberries attention has now turned to harvesting the autumn raspberries.

The Open Afternoon with Cream Teas was a great success with lots of people coming to see the orchard and buying from the cake stall! Many were amazed as they had not realised the size and extent of the orchard or how many trees have been planted. Also the fact that it is a wonderful site and a great place to have a picnic or just walk around in peace and quiet!

On the Bee front unfortunately the smaller of our two swarms of bees has departed for pastures new but we still have the bees in the other hive however they don't have a lot of food so we will need to feed them. Hopefully they will make it through the winter but we will be checking them regularly starting on Sunday 23rd September at 2pm so if you are interested in bees do come along and see what is happening.

We are still having twice weekly sessions, usually Wednesday morning from 10:00 and Sunday afternoon from 2:00, so do come along and help or just come and see what we are doing!

BEWARE OF DOORSTEP CALLERS & PEDDLERS following suspicious incidents across the county. Please can we make you aware that over the last week or so there have been 26 reported suspicious incidents involving peddlers or door to door sellers.

These peddlers are occasionally also known as Nottingham Doorknockers and they have been busy at homes across Warwickshire in recent weeks. A large quantity of them do in fact come from the Nottingham area. They are generally dropped off in an area in gangs and sell household items. Many now seem to confess to being ex-offenders, perhaps trying to astound and disarm you with their honesty!

The appearance of these doorstep sellers is believed to be possibly linked to burglaries and other incidents in the areas targeted. These callers should always have a peddlers certificate with them and, if they do, most of the time, they are not committing a direct offence. However, if you buy items from these people you are likely to be obtaining low quality goods at an inflated price. A much worse outcome is they have a good look at your property with a view to coming back and committing a burglary.

Our advice is don't buy from door to door salesmen.

Police are carrying out operations in several areas of the county and need your help to identify where these peddlers are operating.

If you see them in your area, or have one call at your home, please contact Police on 101 and report the incident. Police will endeavour to attend the area and to speak to the callers and check that they have necessary Peddlers Certificates. If you are harassed or verbally abused by a caller then please call 999.

Community Protection

GOOD MORNING READER,

We have had a lot of calls and emails regarding cold callers and how to know if they are genuine and how to prevent against

- Check ID Properly – check the phone number matches the number in the yellow pages, phone Directory Enquiries or keep a list of useful numbers such as electricity and gas companies near your front door. Don't feel embarrassed leaving them on the doorstep – genuine employees expect their ID to be checked.
- Sign up to the Priority Services Register with your utility providers. This will give you a unique password, among other things, that only you and they know – so you can be sure people at the door are who they say they are.

- Keep your garden preened and the front of your house looking neat – bogus callers are more likely to target houses which look unkempt as they think you're less likely to care.
- Make sure you use your door chain when answering the door and keep it on until you've seen official identification – if you don't already have a door chain contact your local Neighbourhood Police team and they will put you in contact with agencies who can help you.
- Make sure your back door is locked if you go to answer your front door – thieves can work in pairs with one distracting you while the other slips in the back.
- Don't keep large amounts of money in your home. If in doubt, keep them out.
- Only let them in when you have double checked that they are a genuine caller.
- Do not give any bank details unless you are sure and you are happy they are genuine.
- If you still feel uneasy or unhappy about the caller, call Warwickshire Police on 101.

Remember:

- Most people who come to your door will be genuine callers, but it's always best to make sure.
- Fit a door chain or spy hole to help you check who the caller is.
- If you were not expecting someone to call, a genuine caller will not mind waiting outside while you contact their company. Find the number in the phone book or on your latest phone bill. Most companies have a password scheme.
- Genuine delivery personnel usually have uniforms and liveried vehicles and should not need to come into your home. Charity collectors will have identification and will not be offended if you ask to see it.
- If you become uncomfortable after you have let someone into your home, even if it's someone you know, make excuses and leave. Go to a neighbour's house or ask a friend to come back home with you.


